


LADIES AUXILIARY

Bonn, Germany

The Federal City of Bonn is a city on the banks of the Rhine, in the German state of North Rhine-Westphalia, Founded in the 1st century BC as a Roman settlement, Bonn is one of Germany's oldest cities. Composer Ludwig van Beethoven was born in Bonn in 1770. Bonn was the provisional capital of West Germany, following WWII, 1949-1990, and served as the seat of government. Because of a political compromise following German reunification the seat of Germany again became Berlin but the German state maintains a substantial presence in Bonn.



Stuttgart, Germany

Stuttgart

Stuttgart is the capital and largest city of the state of Baden-Württemberg in southwest Germany. The eighth largest city in Germany, Stuttqart is spread across a variety of hills (many of them vineyards), valleys and parks – unusual for a German city and often a source of surprise to visitors who primarily associate the city with its industrial reputation as the 'tradle of the automobile'. Stuttgart lies about an hour from the Black Forest and a similar distance from the

Swabian Jura mountains. The first known settlement of Stuttgart was around the end of the 1st century AD with the establishment of a Roman fort on the banks of the river Neckar. It was in origin a site for breeding cavalry horses as is depicted in its coat of arms. Stuttgart is nicknamed the Schwabenmetropole (Swabian metropolis), because of the city's location in the center of Swabia, and as a reference to the Swabian dialect spoken by its native inhabitants.

Chef Marlis will explore this City in Germany and unlock some of their culinary secrets.
