GTV would like to wish everyone a joyous summer with family time. We would also like to wish all the best of luck to our members who will be competing at Gaufest in Washington DC this July.




EAGLES'

After leaving ABC I found myself as business owner for a tree removal service as well as waiting tables and managing the front of the house of a small café in Manheim, Pa called the Brick House Café. But after some time I decided to leave my partnership and the Cafe and found myself making pizzas again in Smoketown, PA. After being there, I met my husband who I then moved in with. When I made the move to live with my husband I helped in both FOH and BOH at the Bridge Inn where I stayed for a number of years while also working at the club. I've been working at the club part time for about 2 years, and have been a member for about 3 years.
